PENTECOST AND THE LANGUAGE OF GOD

I love the first eleven chapters of Genesis, the story of creation, the fall of humanity and its consequences. These stories are not science texts, or literal history. They are profound stories that tell of the wonder of creation and our human dilemma. We glimpse paradise and yet most of the time we toil with the weeds and thorns of our existence.

The eleventh chapter of Genesis tells the story of the people's languages becoming confused and people are unable to communicate. This is the final consequence of the fall. We simply don't know how to understand God and each other.

The Jesus story, his birth, death, resurrection, ascension, is the story of God's redemption of humanity — of undoing the consequences of the fall. When the Ascended Lord poured out his Spirit on Pentecost, people spoke in different languages and yet were understood.

The differences of language and inability to communicate is a profound problem for our world. It makes us afraid and we create emotional barriers if not physical walls between people. However, at Pentecost we were not given a Spirit of fear, we were given the Spirit of Love.

God's first language is silence. God's second language is the universal language of love. These are the two languages we first need to learn if we are to understand God and one another. Rob+

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF GENESIS.

Genesis 11:1-9

Now the whole earth had one language and the same words. And as they migrated from the east, they came upon a plain in the land of Shinar and settled there. And they said to one another, "Come, let us make bricks, and burn them thoroughly." And they had brick for stone, and bitumen for mortar. Then they said, "Come, let us build ourselves a city, and a tower with its top in the heavens, and let us make a name for ourselves; otherwise we shall be scattered abroad upon the face of the whole earth." The Lord came down to see the city and the tower, which mortals had built. 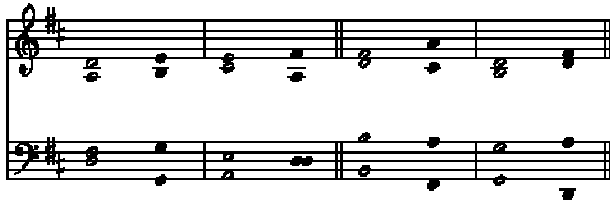

A READING FROM THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES.

Acts 2:1-21

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All

of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, “Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God’s deeds of power.” All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, “What does this mean?” But others sneered and said, “They are filled with new wine.” But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, “Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o’clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: ‘In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord’s great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.’”

People Empower them by your Spirit Lord to know your love is an anchor for their souls as they await the return of their family members.

Intercessor We pray for our parish Search Committee as they prepare to interview candidates for our next rector.

JUNE ADULT FORUMS

In June we will be looking at the Mysticism of St. Paul. St. Paul's writings are often experienced and interpreted in a very legalistic way which deprives the reader of the grace and life that is inherent in Paul's teaching. In this series of classes we will look at the mystical side of Paul's experience and teaching and discover the foundation of his, and our, relationship to God.

June 9: The nature of mystical experiences. It's not just the Damascus road.

We all have mystical experiences, but most of the time we don't realize what they are. In this class we will look at the phenomena of mystical experiences as distinct from the content of such experiences.

In this class we will explore Paul's mystical understanding of "The Christ." Notice Paul doesn't often refer to the historic Jesus, who he didn't know, but repeatedly refers to the Risen Christ, who he did know.

June 30: Nothing can separate us from the Love of God, in Christ Jesus our Lord.

In this class we will explore Paul's awareness of God's love as the foundation of faith.
