The people are seated.

The Wardens, Stewart Abbot and Patricia Streeter stand near the Bishop.

The Bishop states the purpose of the gathering; and concludes,

People of Trinity, you have reflected on your ministry and discerned your choice for a new Rector.

Wardens We have chosen and called Lisa Flores Musser to be our Rector, and she has accepted.

Bishop I commend your choice and affirm this call. I fully empower and authorize Lisa to exercise her ministry as a priest of this diocese.

The Bishop reads the Letter of Institution to the Congregation.

Bishop Are you, the people of Trinity, ready to continue in your ministry, with Lisa as your priest?

People **We are.**

The Wardens escort the Priest from the nave to the front of the assembly.

The Junior Warden, Patricia Streeter, presents the keys of the church saying,

Lisa, having been chosen by the people of Trinity, and instituted as our Rector by the Bishop, I present to you the keys of the church and give your charge of these premises.

The Canon to the Ordinary, The Rev. Cn. Alex Dyer, presents the Constitution and Canons of the Church, saying,

Lisa, obey these canons, and be among us to share the councils of this diocese.

THE WORD OF GOD

Carol Bond and Clifford Clift, representatives of the lectors, come forward to present a Bible and say,

Lisa, with this Bible we proclaim and hear God's living Word. Join us in the ministry of telling the Good News to the World.

Rector Amen. Let us hear again the Good News of salvation.

THE LESSON: Jeremiah 17:7-8

Reader: A Reading from the book of the prophet Jeremiah.

Blessed are those who trust in the LORD, whose trust is the LORD. They shall be like a tree planted by water, sending out its roots by the stream. It shall not fear when heat comes, and its leaves shall stay green; in the year of drought it is not anxious, and it does not cease to bear fruit.

Reader Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.

People **Thanks be to God.**

THE PSALM: PSALM 16:5-11

Reader: Please join me in reading the portion of Psalm 16 appointed for today by the half verse.

⁵O LORD, you are my portion and my cup; *
it is you who uphold my lot.

⁶My boundaries enclose a pleasant land; *

⁷I will bless the LORD who gives me counsel; *

THE GOSPEL: Mark 10:35-45

Priest The Holy Gospel of our Savior Jesus Christ according to Mark.

³⁵James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to him and said to him, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." ³⁶And he said to them, "What is it you want me to do for you?" ³⁷And they said to him, "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory." ³⁸But Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?" ³⁹They replied, "We are able." Then Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; ⁴⁰but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared."

THE RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL VOWS

All stand.

Bishop Lisa, and the people of Trinity: in Holy Baptism we received full adoption through God's grace and full empowerment for ministry through the Holy Spirit. Will you work together as partners in the mission of the Church, to reconcile all people to God through Christ?

People **We will, with God's help.**

Bishop The water of baptism signifies our eternal covenant with God. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to Christ, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

The Bishop may bless the water.

We pray you, O God, sanctify this water by the power of your Holy Spirit, that all who in baptism are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior.

The Bishop presents a vessel of water, saying,

Lisa, take this water, and help me baptize in obedience to our Lord.

Rector Let us renew the solemn promises and vows of Holy Baptism, by which we renounce Satan and all his works, and promise to serve God faithfully in God's holy Catholic Church.

Water is poured into the font.

Bishop Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil and renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?

People **I do.**

Bishop Do you believe in God the Father?

People **I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

Bishop Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People **I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

Bishop Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People **I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**

Bishop Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Bishop Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Bishop Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Bishop Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?
People **I will, with God's help.**

Bishop Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?
People **I will, with God's help.**

Bishop May Almighty God, who has given us a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, bestowed upon us the forgiveness of sins, and called us to ministry in Jesus Christ, keep us in eternal life by his grace; through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

To deliver us from the power of sin and death and to reveal the riches of your grace, you looked with favor upon Mary, your willing servant, that she might conceive and bear a son, Jesus your holy child.
